The costs of recovery and rebuilding peoples homes and lives are much, but we have watched as God has supplied all of our needs through His people from all across the country.

As Curt and Mary Jo head to their next assignment, their living expenses along with the costs of rebuilding will be great. There are many ministries that raise money for disaster relief. I cannot recommend one more highly than Curt and Mary Jo.
