Since we only get small amounts of time with them here and there, this was truly a blessing, especially to be like other grandparents and have the grandkids for sleepovers, play dates, lunch dates etc! bought houses while we were there so we were able to help them with things needed done before they moved in. We also did a lot of maintenance on our equipment. It was a much needed break from the road, but soon it was time to head out again!

We received a call from Pastor Chris of Calvary Frontlines in Arkansas. A historic flood had hit their area. He was calling for guidance of what they could do to help their community. We were busy with maintenance and spending quality time with our family and told him we could advise, but not come. But then God!! So we packed up our stuff, said good-bye to our family and CC Savannah and headed to Arkansas!

It's always quite an undertaking to pack up, move, unpack and set up Camp Calvary and this was no different. Mary Jo's back was worse then normal so it took a little while longer. God worked out a couple things for us to get help driving. Then when we arrived we had no water, sewer, or electric for either of the RV's. It took me a week just to get all of that figured out, piped, wired, and running! We needed both RV roofs resealed and I was able to get the bunkhouse done in GA because it was being stored in the open. The 5th wheel had to wait until we got to AR to not be under trees so that also added a few days on each end.



We've been serving in Moffett, OK, an extremely poor town where every home was flooded. We've helped several homeowners do different things and are currently working on completely rebuilding the interiors of 2 of them.
